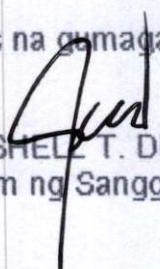

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND PROMOTION OF FARM TOURISM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CAVINTI AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE.

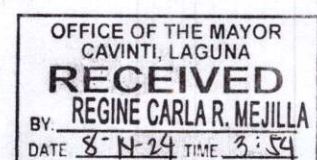
WHEREAS, unknown to many especially the farmers is that Congress had enacted a law on Farm Tourism, Republic Act No. 10816 otherwise known as the "FARM TOURISM DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 2016", providing for the development and promotion of farm tourism in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Republic Act No. 7160 otherwise known as The Local Government Code of the Philippines of 1991, Basic Services (i)for the Municipality, Extension and on-site research services and facilities related to Agriculture and Fishery Activities which include dispersal of livestock and poultry, fingerlings, and other seeding materials for aquaculture;

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WHEREAS, Section 2 of the R.A. No. 10816, the State recognizes the importance of Agriculture in making available food and other products necessary to sustain and enhance human life, and in providing livelihood to a major portion of the population;

WHEREAS, Section 6(1) of R. A. No. 9583 empowers DOT to formulate and promulgate, in consultation with the LGUs, the private sector industries and other tourism stakeholders, rules and regulations governing the operation and activities of all tourism enterprises, including but not limited to a national standard for licensing, accreditation and classification of tourism enterprises, prescribing therein minimum levels of operating quality and efficiency for their operation in accordance with recognized international standards, impose reasonable penalties for violation of accreditation policies;

WHEREAS, the State further recognizes that tourism, coupled with agriculture extension services, can disseminate the value of agriculture in the economic and cultural development of the country, serve as a catalyst for the development of agriculture and fishery communities and provide additional income for farmers, farmworkers, and fisher folk;

WHEREAS, Section 46 of Republic Act No. 8435 or The Agriculture and Fisheries Modernization Act of 1997, that the Department and the LGUs shall also strengthen its agricultural engineering groups to provide the necessary technical and engineering support in carrying out the smooth and expeditious implementation of agricultural infrastructure projects;

WHEREAS, in total view and the fact that Cavinti is a primarily and agricultural and tourism town, this piece of legislation is filed in the hope of facilitating and fast-tracking the development and promotion of farm tourism in this part of our country;

NOW, THEREFORE, upon the motion of **HON. ROMEL J. VILLANUEVA**, be it resolved adopting an Ordinance for Farm Tourism Development of this town.

BE ENACTED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Cavinti is Session duly assembled.

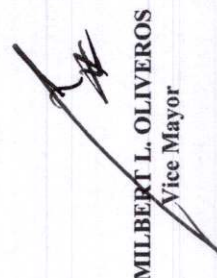
SECTION 1. TITLE. This ordinance shall be known and cited as the "**FARM TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AND PROMOTION ACT OF CAVINTI 2024.**"

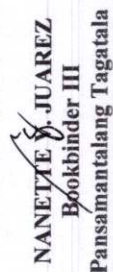
SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is hereby the declared policy of the Municipal Government of Cavinti to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the town by encouraging, developing and promoting farm tourism.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean as follows:

3.1. FARM TOURISM – the practice of attracting visitors and tourists to farm areas for production, educational and recreational purposes. It involves any agricultural or fishery-based operation or activity that brings to farm visitors, tourists, farmers, fisher folks and students who want to be educated and trained


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on farming and its related activities and provides a venue for outdoor recreation and accessible family outings.

3.2. FARM TOURISM ACTIVITY – any activity carried out on a farm that allows visitors and tourists to enjoy farming or fishing experience through education, recreation or leisure.

3.3. FARM TOURISM CAMP – any farm area that allows visitors and tourists to visit, get involved in farm activities, and enjoy and learn rural lifestyle.

3.4. FARM TOURISM OPERATOR – any person, company or recognized group, who is the owner or overall in-charge of a farm tourism camp.

3.5. FARM TOURISM PRACTITIONER- any person who is engaged in providing one or more farm tourism activities.

3.6. ACCREDITATION – a certification officially recognizing a farm tourism camp as having complied with the minimum standards for farm tourism.

3.7. AGRICULTURAL CROPS- refers to cultivated plants of which products are harvested at some point in their growth stage intended for human consumption. It includes, but are not limited to, rice, corn, cacao, vegetables, fruits, fiber crops, root crops, and ornamental plants;

3.8. ANIMAL PRODUCTION – refers to the activity of raising domestic or domesticated animals or organisms including bovine, ovine, porcine, caprine, equine, poultry, and bees, for food or in the production of food or other agricultural products. The products of hunting or fishing of wild animals shall not be considered part of this definition;

3.9. AQUACULTURE – refers to fishery operation involving the breeding and farming of fish and other fishery species in fresh, marine and brackish water areas;

3.10. CAMPING – refers to a recreational activity in which participants take up temporary residence in the outdoors, usually using tents;

3.11. DAY FARM – refers to farms ideal for day visits which may be in the form of farm tour, farm work experience, farm restaurant, pick and pay, etc;

3.12. DEMONSTRATION FARM – shall refer to a farm that serves mainly as a research or demonstration site of numerous agricultural techniques which are usually owned and operated by educational and government institutions (i.e. Department of Agriculture-Agricultural Training Institute, Local government Units, Agricultural Universities);

3.13. DIRECT AGRICULTURAL SALES- shall refer to the sale of farm crops or livestock grown on the farm or other farm operations in the local agricultural area, including the sale of retail incidental items and fee-based activity to promote the sale of farm crops or livestock sold at the farm stand;


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3.14. FARM OWNER – shall refer to the registered owner of the land utilized as a farm, or the possessor of a farm by virtue of a lease agreement or similar legal instrument;

3.15. FARM PRODUCT/s – shall refer to fresh and processed products of the farm;

3.16. FARM RESORTS – refers to farms that offer accommodation and dining services, for the purpose of participating in or enjoying interactive on-farm activities and other attractions offered to enrich tourist's farm life experience. Farm resorts were previously given accreditation pursuant to the Rules and Regulations of Govern the Accreditation of Agri-Tourism/Farm Sites;

3.17. FARM STAYS – refers to farms that offer accommodation and meals for guests who stay for the purpose of participating in or enjoying interactive in-farm activities and other services offered to enrich the farm life experiences. It may be in the form of a farm house, farm lodge, cabana, etc;

3.18. GLAMPING – otherwise known as glamorous camping, shall refer to a form of camping where accommodation facilities are more luxurious than a traditional camping tent;

3.19. GUEST – shall refer to any person travelling to a place other than of his/her usual environment (usual place of residence) for less than 12 months and whose main purpose of trip is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited;

SECTION 4. SCOPE AND COVERAGE. This Ordinance shall apply to the accreditation of all Farm Tourism Camps/sites in the Municipality.

SECTION 5. FARM TOURISM STRATEGIC ACTION PLAN. The Municipal Government of Cavinti shall formulate a Farm Tourism Strategic Action Plan which shall be the comprehensive set of programs, projects and activities for the growth of farm tourism in the Municipality. The plan shall be integrated and be made consistent with the Municipal Development Plan in line with National Tourism Development Plan.

The plan shall cover, among others, areas of concern:

- a. investment promotion and financing;
- b. market research;
- c. trends, innovations and information;
- d. accreditation of farm tourism camps;
- e. market promotion and development;
- f. agriculture and fishery research;
- g. development and extension;
- h. institutional and human resource development;
- i. and infrastructure support.

It shall likewise define the roles and responsibilities of component local government units, farm tourism operators, farm tourism practitioners, tour operators, educational institutions, and other industry stakeholders in the implementation of the plan.

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SECTION 6. CREATION OF FARM TOURISM DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE. There is hereby created the Farm Tourism Development Committee under the Office of the Mayor which shall formulate plans and programs for the development and promotion of farm tourism in the Municipality and shall set the overall direction for the implementation of the Farm Tourism Strategic Action Plan. It shall have the following powers and functions:

- Formulate, advocate, coordinate, oversee and assess the implementation of the Farm Strategic Action Plan;
- Increase awareness in the value of farm tourism through advocacy campaigns and marketing activities;
- Recommend infrastructure projects and transportation programs for funding;
- Formulate and oversee the conduct of farm tourism research and development projects to ensure sustainability of the municipalities farm tourism program, such as but not limited to, market research, trends and innovations, and information dissemination; financing requirements; industry manpower development; resource productivity and utilization improvement; and sustainable agriculture practices and education;
- Create technical panels, working groups, or task forces that will assist the Committee in the performance of its functions; and
- Establish cooperation among, and/ or request the assistance of the concerned agencies, offices or instrumentalities of the government, farm tourism stakeholders, financial and educational institutions, non-government organizations, people's organizations and other like-minded institutions and individuals in the implementation of tis functions and the attainment of the objectives of this ordinance.

SECTION 7. COMPOSITION. The Farm Tourism Committee shall be composed of the Following:

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SECTION 8. SECRETARIAT. There shall be a Committee Secretariat to be chosen by the Chairperson of the Committee from among the Committee Members.

SECTION 9. PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT. The Farm Tourism Development Committee shall develop, programs linking stakeholders with the concerned entities with respect to investment, promotion, financing, incentives, market research and information on farm tourism pursuant to its powers and functions in Section 5 hereof.

SECTION 10. ACCREDITATION OF FARM TOURISM CAMPS. The Farm Tourism Development Committee shall assist in the accreditation of farm tourism camps in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 10816 otherwise known as the "Farm Tourism Development Act of 2016."

SECTION 11. CATEGORIES OF FARM TOURISM CAMP. For purposes of accreditation, Farm Tourism Camp shall be categorized as follows:

- 11.1. Day Farms; or
- 11.2. Farm Stays.

SECTION 12. MINIMUM STANDARD REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCREDITATION

12.1. Pre-Entry Requirements – To be eligible for accreditation, the Farm Tourism Camp must be:

12.1.a. Involved in the cultivation of, or continuously producing any of the following:

- a. Agricultural Crops;
- b. Animals; or
- c. Aquaculture products

12.1.b. Situated in a generally safe and peaceful location;

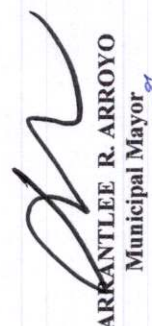
12.1.c. Accessible through local intermodal public transportation, such as jeepneys, tricycles, Banca's, habal-habal, etc;

12.1.d. Have access to facilities such as roads, electricity, water, and communication services;

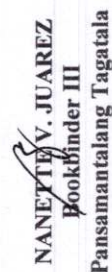
12.1.e. Primarily involved in farm production, and not accommodation services as its main business.

12.2. Minimum Requirements Common for Day Farms and Farm Stays. The following are the minimum aggregate land area of the Farm Tourism Camp/Site shall be as follows (Farm Size) :

- 12.2.a. Day Farm – 1,500 sqm**
- 12.2.b. Farm Stay – 3,000 sqm**


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The minimum size requirement shall not apply to Farm Tourism Camps/sites that have already been accredited or have applied for accreditation prior to the implementation of these rules.

SECTION 13. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Office of the Mayor shall issue the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance within ninety (90) days from the effectivity.

SECTION 14. ROLE OF THE TOURISM DEVELOPMENT COUNCILS. The existing Municipal Development Councils shall coordinate with the Farm Tourism Development Committee and endeavor to develop Farm Tourism Camps and to initiate Farm Tourism Activities in their respective area and provide funds therefor.

The Municipal Government and the Nineteen (19) Barangay Governments may, in the promotion and development of farm tourism, enter into joint venture or other modalities with the private sector in accordance with applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.

SECTION 15. FUNDING. The amount Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php50,000.00) as initial fund from the General Fund for the next Fiscal year of the Municipal Government of Cavinti is hereby appropriated for the operation of the Farm Tourism Development Committee.

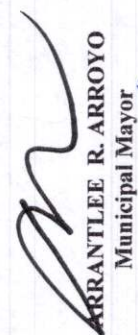
SECTION 16. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, rules and regulations and other issuances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

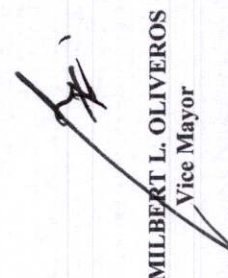
SECTION 17. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason, any provision, section or any part of this ordinance is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction or suspended or revoked by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, such judgment shall not affect or impair the remaining provisions, sections or parts hereof which shall remain and continue to be in full force and effect.

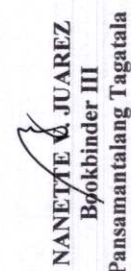
SECTION 18. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. This Ordinance shall take effect after Fifteen (15) Days after this publication in the official website and Social Media Account of the Sangguniang Bayan and the Municipality of Cavinti or by posting in nineteen (19) Barangay Bulletin Board.

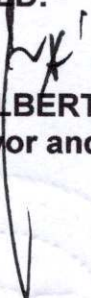

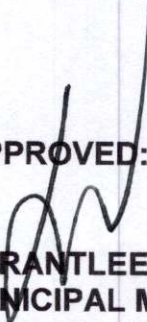
